Administrators' Convocation 2010, Change in Date: The date for the 2010 Convocation has been changed to *August 9 and 10 at Water's Edge Resort*. Sr. Mary C. Mullaly, FMA from Corralitos, CA will lead our sixth annual Administrators' Convocation on *Transformational Leadership through Personal Transformation: The Call to Holiness and Leadership*.

"Survey Says": The Office of Catholic Schools periodically surveys its web viewers with current issues of interest.

- During the period of August 15 to September 14, we asked "should school instruction begin before or after the Labor Day holiday?" From a total of 170 votes, **61% indicated after Labor Day**, 30% before, and it made no difference to 9%. *This is certainly a topic for discussion with school boards.*
- During the period of September 15 – September 30, we asked "are Catholic schools providing enough information regarding the H1N1 influenza?" From a total of 49 votes, **63% indicated yes**, and 37% no. Although responses were minimal, *we must remain committed to keeping parents and/or guardians abreast of the most recent information on the H1N1 influenza.*

Updated Info on Pandemic Flu Preparedness (H1N1 virus): A national flu summit held in Washington, D.C. on July 9, warned of a potential significant outbreak of the H1N1 flu this fall. On August 7, the federal government released updated guidelines at <http://pandemicflu.gov/professional/school>, and a new toolkit at <http://pandemicflu.gov/professional/school/toolkit.html> to help school officials prepare for and respond to the H1N1 flu in the coming school year. The guidance document applies to any flu virus circulating during the 2009-2010 school year, including the 2009 H1N1 flu. The new guidelines acknowledge the need to balance the risks of illness among students and staff with the benefits of keeping students in school. Specific steps are

offered for school staff, parents, and students to take given the current flu conditions as well as for more severe flu conditions.

Regarding decisions about school dismissal, the current thinking is that no schools should have to close, but if they do because of extreme circumstances, administrators need to make certain that education continues. The toolkit advises school officials to develop a school dismissal plan and options for how school work can be continued at home (e.g., homework packets, web-based lessons, phone calls).

Schools should consider posting information on pandemic flu preparedness on their websites. The Office of Catholic Schools will continue to maintain a link with updated information on the H1N1 virus on our home page.
